# 1. Introduction

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all members of the Clifton High School community remain safe, and that pupils' conduct and behaviour is such that teaching and learning can flourish. High standards are expected by the School. Pupils must make every effort to produce their best at all times, whether in lessons, homework tasks or extra-curricular activities. Pupils are ambassadors for the School and their behaviour and appearance should always be exemplary.

Pupils breaking any of the rules outlined in this policy, or the Attendance or Online Safety policies, will be subjected to the sanctions listed in the Behaviour Policy - Senior School.

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## 2. Attendance

Registration starts at 8.40 and the School day ends at 16.00. Pupils who arrive at school before 8.00 must go directly to their form room.

It is a legal requirement for pupils to attend school and for the School to record pupils' attendance at school. Further information can be found in the Attendance policy.

Absences should be notified/permissions sought as follows:

- Planned absence (including where pupils have to leave School during the school day): the parent must obtain permission from the School in advance by sending an email to <a href="mailto:absence@cliftonhigh.co.uk">absence@cliftonhigh.co.uk</a> copying in the class teacher/form tutor.
- Unplanned absence (i.e. sickness): the parent must notify the School by 8.40 by sending an email to <u>absence@cliftonhigh.co.uk</u> copying in the form tutor.
- Requests for an authorised absence: the parent must send written correspondence in advance to the Deputy Head, Pastoral An absence can only be approved by the Deputy Head, Pastoral.

If pupils have to leave School during the school day, they must sign out using the electronic 'sign-in' app located in the School Office on leaving and sign in if they return later that day.

Sixth From students may leave the School site during lunch time and after Period 5 if they do not have any afternoon lessons. Students must sign in and out using the electronic 'sign-in' app located in the Sixth Form Centre, main School Building or School Office.

If pupils are unwell during the School day or if pupils feel unwell during your lesson, the subject teacher will give permission to visit the School Nurse. All pupils can make their own way to the School Nurse unless they are unfit to do so, in which case they will be chaperoned by another pupil. The School Nurse may send a pupil home and will notify the School Office and the subject teacher for that lesson that a pupil has left the premises. Pupils should not ring their parent directly as this will be dealt with by the School Nurse.

## 3. Anti-Bullying

Bullying is defined as the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or remotely/online.

Bullying is always unacceptable and Clifton High School upholds a zero-tolerance policy to any form of bullying or abuse. Every pupil has the right to be safe and happy in Clifton High School and to be protected from feeling vulnerable.

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If pupils are being bullied, or suspect that bullying of others is taking place, they should tell a trusted adult immediately. Further information can be found in the Child Protection and Safeguarding Anti Bullying policy.

# 4. Respect for Others

Pupils must be respectful and polite to all members of the school community. Any kind of offensive or physical behaviour towards any member of the School community is unacceptable. The use of inappropriate language such as swearing is not tolerated, whether said or written down on paper or on a screen. Pupils are to treat everyone with respect, regardless of their gender, ethnicity, sexuality or belief. Clifton High School has a zero tolerance to any form of bullying. Quite simply it will not be tolerated, and any reported incidents will be investigated in line with the level approach given to the misconduct and suggested sanctions offered in the Behaviour policy.

# 5. Uniform

Pupils are expected to wear school uniform correctly at all times, with the exception of those days where 'non-uniform' is allowed. Further information can be found in the Uniform – Senior policy.

# 6. Work Ethic

Pupils should arrive punctually to all lessons, equipped and ready to learn. Pupils are encouraged to try their best in everything they do and allow others to do the same.

# 7. Moving Around the School

Pupils must show an awareness and respect for each other when moving around the School. This includes walking quietly and sensibly indoors, holding doors open for each other, letting staff members enter first and keeping left in busy corridors. Before entering any room where a staff member is present, pupils should knock first to seek permission to enter the room.

Pupils queue sensibly and where possible should queue in a straight line for example when waiting to enter the Dining Room.

## 8. School Environment

Pupils must show respect for the School environment, which includes the school buildings both inside and outside, the outdoor playing and garden areas and other peoples' property.

Pupils must be responsible for and are in charge of all their personal belongings and respect other peoples' property:

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- pupils must keep lockers, cloakroom and desks tidy. Pupils must keep belongings safe in their allocated locker;
- money brought to School should be kept on the pupil and not left in bags or in unlocked lockers;
- pupils must not collect money in School without permission from a member of staff;
- all clothing and major items of equipment should be marked with the pupils' name;
- loss or damage to expensive personal items is not covered by the School's insurance and therefore should not be brought to School; and
- pupils must not remove or damage other people's property.

Pupils should keep their work areas and communal areas tidy. Vandalism and the dropping of litter will not be tolerated.

# 9. Mobile Phones (and other Internet enabled devices)

Pupils are allowed to have a mobile phone, smart watch or other similar device (**mobile devices**) at School; however, it is not a requirement for them to have one. The following rules apply to mobile devices:

- 1. mobile devices are not to be used at any time in School, unless a teacher has given specific permission for them to be used for educational purposes;
- 2. Sixth Form students are allowed to use mobile devices, but only in the Sixth Form Centre;
- 3. mobile devices must remain on silent throughout the day;
- 4. pupils are not allowed to take any photographs, videos, or sound recordings of any member of the school community, unless consent has been granted;
- 5. no pupil should post anything on a social networking site that affects the well-being of another pupil, or a member of the School community. Nothing should be posted that brings the reputation of the School into disrepute;
- 6. pupils must not view or share any age-inappropriate material; and
- 7. mobile devices must not be taken into any public examination or school assessments.

Staff may confiscate a mobile device that is being inappropriately used and it will be stored securely in the School Office until 16.10, when it may be collected. In certain circumstances parents will be informed and the device will be returned to them.

# 10. Acceptable Use of Information Communication Technology (ICT) Agreement

All pupils must accept the Acceptable Use of ICT Agreement on an annual basis or when any changes are made. The agreement will appear on first logon to a School device, and an acceptance is required to access the network.

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Pupils should be aware that failure to comply with the Acceptable Use of ICT Agreement may result in the temporary or permanent withdrawal of access to any of the School's IT system.

Email and internet access is a privilege and not a right and is provided to assist pupils with their learning and to help them improve their IT skills. Pupils are responsible for the content of any email that is sent from their account. Pupils who act inconsiderately or irresponsibly or abuse the system may have use of this system withdrawn or this could result in temporary suspension or permanent exclusion. Pupils should be aware that their School electronic communications may be monitored.

## 11. Out of Bounds

In the interests of safety, pupils are not allowed to enter any of the following rooms in the School without a member of staff being present:

- Science Laboratories
- Food Technology Room
- Product Design Workshop
- Swimming Pool
- Fitness and Wellbeing Suite
- Climbing Wall
- Medical Centre
- School Kitchen.

Staff rooms, offices, staff toilets and staff changing areas remain out of bounds at all times.

## 12. Food

Pupils are encouraged to eat healthily both in school and whilst on school trips. Pupils are only allowed to eat in the Dining Room, Sixth Form Centre and on the playground. Food should not be removed from the Dining Hall.

Chewing gum is not permitted in the School or at any school-related activity.

## 13. Pupil Voice

Being a member of Clifton High School means that pupils have the opportunity to express opinions on School matters to benefit the community as a whole. Once every half-term, pupils' views are heard in the School Council via the School Council Representative. The School Council is run by the Head Boy and Head Girl with the support of the deputies and prefects. Every half term the Head's Team and School Council Representatives meet to discuss the matters discussed at the School Council meeting. These are then raised with the relevant members of Senior Leadership. The responses and actions that take place are then fed-back to pupils.

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## 14. Substances

Smoking, consumption of alcohol and the possession, taking of or under the influence of any illegal substances or legal highs is forbidden in school or on any school-related activity, which includes educational visits, trips, tours and fixtures. 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# Pupils' Code of Conduct Year 7 - Sixth Form

# Allow yourself and others to learn Respect yourself, respect each other and respect your environment Be punctual and be equipped

## Key Points of Pupil Conduct

- Arrive and register on time and be fully prepared for lessons. •
- Take pride in your appearance and make sure that school rules concerning uniform are • observed
- Blazers must be worn at all times, including lunch and school assemblies. •
- Move sensibly about School with awareness of others. •
- Do not run, and in congested areas keep to the left. •
- Chewing-gum is not permitted. •
- When a class is in session, knock before you enter the classroom, and wait to receive the • teacher's permission to enter.
- No pupil should post anything on a social networking site that may affect the well-being • of another pupil, or a member of the school community. Nothing should be posted that brings the reputation of the School into disrepute.
- Speak politely to everyone and use an appropriate tone of voice. •
- Inappropriate verbal or written language by any means is not tolerated and could result in temporary suspension or permanent expulsion.
- Respect other people's property and privacy of spaces. •
- Be silent whenever requested, particularly during fire drills, examinations and • assemblies.
- Keep the School clean and tidy so that it is a welcoming place and take pride in your environment.
- Act as a school ambassador when in school uniform both inside and outside the school • premises.
- Consumption of illegal substances as well as smoking and alcohol is forbidden in School • and whilst taking part in any school activity.
- Respect other people's point of view and do not criticise or make others feel in any way uncomfortable because their tastes, abilities or preferences differ from yours.
- Bullying, of any description, is unacceptable. Pupils who bully or abuse other members of the school community in any form may face temporary suspension or permanent expulsion.
- Any kind of offensive or physical behaviour towards any member of the school community is unacceptable and could result in temporary suspension or permanent expulsion.

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
